**DETAILS:** Featured keynote speaker will be Nainoa Thompson of the Polynesian Voyaging Society. Workshop topics include learning about energy, voyaging, robotics, coding, polymers, earthquakes, volcanoes, circuits, air pressure, science and magic, nano science, and the Fibonacci sequence in nature. The closing assembly will feature a STEM magic show and STEM demonstrations.

ABOUT: The Astronaut Lacy Veach Day of Discovery honors the life and legacy of the late Charles Lacy Veach, who grew up in Honolulu with an interest in science, had a distinguished career as a fighter pilot in the United States Air Force, and went on to fly two Space Shuttle missions.
