The above Refund of the 2011 Interim Rate Increase is based on the completion of the refund reconciliation, which returned the reconciled balance of \$137,275 to Hawaiian Electric customers during January 2013. The reconciled balance of \$137,275 consisted of two components. The first component was a reconciliation balance of \$39,943, which is the difference between \$367,500, as approved by the Public Utilities Commission, and \$329,486 returned to Hawaiian Electric customers from May 21, 2012 through June 19, 2012 across all rate schedules, plus interest and revenue taxes. The second component was a reconciliation balance of \$97,332, which is the difference between \$881,900, as approved by the Public Utilities Commission, and \$787,031 returned to Hawaiian Electric customers during September 2012 across all rate schedules, plus interest and revenue taxes.
